5.0 PRINCIPAL'S REPORTS

Physical Restraint - new rules and guidelines for schools - the board talked through the new guidelines and the new policies that have been developed.

Staff Only Days - all schools have two staff only days as allocated by the MOE. We have had one but have another one to take in Term 4 for professional development and curriculum refresh. We also had one allowed for within our school year.

7.0 PROPERTY REPORT

Richard reported on the school property plan and the projects in the five-year plan. We have \$17,000 available for minor projects. The drainage came in under budget and we have \$21,000 we could do something with.

There are issues with flooding at the road crossing. That is an issue that rests with Council and we are in discussion with them.

Discussion around what we need to spend funds on. We could use some more seating around the school but we would have to find some way of fixing them in so that they could not be moved. Shade sails are also important but again would need to be fixed in some way. Bike rack space is also required and there are discussions underway with Council to move the fence out to accommodate some bike racks.

Line marking is still planned. The moving of the shed is due in the middle of June. There has been a Coronation Tree planting and other upgrades to the grounds.

There are some internal doors required.
